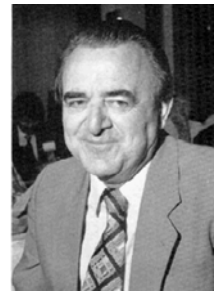

Good Morning Doctor –

Dr. Gordon Christensen says (in jest) that “this” is the only dental technique that works everywhere else in the world except the United States. But first, a little dental history lesson:

The recognition for developing modern root canal treatments belongs to Dr. Louis Grossman, who originated the principles and purposes of saving teeth, while he lived in Europe. He moved to the United States in the 1930s, and continued his interest in developing a root canal treatment that could save teeth. At that time, the concept of “foci of infection” by teeth (teeth causing infection throughout the body), was very strong, and Dr. Grossman had to overcome the belief that extracting teeth was the cure for arthritis and many other misunderstood ailments.

Dr. Angelo Sargenti began teaching his enhancements of the conventional root canal method in 1948, in Switzerland. He confirmed that the techniques of Dr. Grossman had limitations, in that even with the most thorough cleaning and preparation of the canal(s), all the pulpal debris and bacteria could not be removed from these canal(s), and especially the inaccessible accessory canals that comprise every tooth anatomy. The Sargenti N2 Method, as it is now known, is the most widely used root canal technique in Europe today, especially since there are a very limited number of endodontic specialists there. Dr. Sargenti introduced his N2 Method into the United States in Dallas, Texas in 1958. Then Dr. Alvin Arzt continued the message (and all hell broke loose), including the “ambush” of Dr. Arzt on a couple of nationally televised programs.

- The use of a 6.5% paraformaldehyde in the sealer (actually 4.0% active level) has never been proven to be toxic or detrimental to humans. More formaldehyde in foods than in N2
- The Sargenti root canal technique is the same basic root canal technique taught in every dental school
- The Sargenti root canal technique, now identical with conventional root canal techniques, is practiced within the standards of care
- The American Dental Association does not recognize any society or association as setting standards of care
- Dentists, in order to make sure the canals have no bacteria remaining after instrumentation, will incorporate Formocresol (19% paraformaldehyde and 30% cresol) into their sealer. This is universally practiced in general dentistry and is used more exclusively in pediatric dentistry
- No root canal sealer is accepted by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, **but is sold under a 510K**
- The use of irrigating solutions in endodontics, such as Clorox (sodium hypochlorite) is not accepted by the FDA for this purpose
